Before you read

Discuss:

- 4. What do we have in common?
- 5. What does he/ she look like?

While you read

1. Find and write down adjectives from page 87-95.

(Clue: good, empty, miserable, short, clean, far, shy, old, typical, lazy, adventurous, exciting, brown- haired, blue- eyed, good-looking, young, chubby, dark- haired, cheerful, little funny, fat, amazing, short, greying black, beautiful, handsome, tall, balding, alarming, wild, favourite)

- 2. Sort them to physical description and character qualities.
- 3. Find comparatives and superlatives of adjectives. (e.g. chubbier, the most amazing, younger, more adventurous etc.)
- 4. Find constructions with comparisons

(e.g. he was as good as...)

5. Grammar

1. What do you remember from the chapter? Tick the right word.
