History of the U.S.A.

1492

Christopher Columbus discovered America and met the native Americans (called them the Indians). Settlement by Europeans was slow and at first only Spanish explorers showed an interest. www.youtube.com Christopher Columbus: What Really Happened

1607

The first colony was founded in Virginia, called according to the Queen – Virgin Queen.

1620

In November the small ship Mayflower brought a group of English Puritans, who had left England to avoid religious persecution, to Massachuttes. They are known as the **Pilgrims Fathers**. There were 100 people. They landed near Boston at the place called Plymouth. Half

of them died of starvation during the first winter. Those who survived asked for help to built houses and grow corn, vegetables and fruits the Indians. They celebrated their first successful harvest with a feast of Thanksgiving Day next November. Since that time Tkanksgiving Day has been celebrated on the 4th Thursday in November (in Canada a month earlier because of earlier winter.)

18th century

1775 - 1781

The War of Independence

Thirteen colonies fought against the British rule. Famous Congresses took place in Philadelphia.

1789

The first President was **George Washington** . He is called the father of the country. In 1800 the capital was called according to him. Until that time Philadelphia was the capital.

1788

The constitution was adopted. People often say that this Constitution was a model for Europe.

1861 - 1865

The Civil War between the North and the South.

In the 19th century more than 10 million settlers arrived from Europe. They settled in the north where industry was developing rapidly.

Agriculture South used the hard work of slaves and the North did not agree so Abraham Lincoln, the 16th American President, declared the abolition of slavery Emancipation Proclamation of 1863.

Confederate commander, General Lee, was from the South. The Union commander, General Grant, was from the North (Yankies)
